Ann was a member of the Corporate Board of State Bank and Trust prior to its merger with Cadence Bank. She is a member of the Advisory Board of the Georgia Conservancy. She is an active member of the Atlanta Rotary and was the 2018 recipient of the M. Collier Ross Leadership Award. In 2022, she was honored with and humbled by a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Atlanta Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals. She is a board member of Adventure Scientists, a Montana-based organization that collects data for scientists to address critical challenges to the environment and human health.

Ann currently consults with the Atlanta History Center, with her longtime client, the Atlanta Botanical Garden, as they grow the garden along the BeltLine, with MOCA GA and their new museum at the Goat Farm, and with YWCA of Greater Atlanta as they work to reopen the historic Phyllis Wheatley branch on the Westside to benefit the women and children of the surrounding community.

A graduate of Duke University, Ann is the immediate past chair of the Advisory Board for Duke University Libraries, a past chair of the Duke University Women's Studies Council, and a six-year member of the Board of Visitors for Trinity College at Duke.
